Dear Congregants,

WE HEARD YOU! We are home and able to hold all our High Holy Day worship services at Temple. To ensure success we ask members to follow the age restrictions on services unless a special request has been accepted. Please review this information which will guide you through the Holy Days at Temple.

Member Family Tickets

- High Holy Day Ticket information will be mailed this summer to members in good standing.
- Based on children's ages, families will be assigned to early or late services for evening and morning of both Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Members with no children will be assigned to the late services.
- Adults attending without children may attend either service, space permitting. Your request must accompany your membership renewal and assignments to early or late services will be made on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Families with children 13 years old and younger will attend the early services while families with children 14 years old and older will attend the late services. Families with children 14 years old and older may request the early services. These requests will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis space permitting.
- Each ticket will be good for all services. **TICKETS MUST BE CARRIED BY THE TICKET HOLDER AT ALL TIMES AND WILL BE CHECKED AT ALL SERVICES** (except Yizkor).
- A minimum of 25% of your membership amount must be paid prior to Sept. 1, 2011 in order to receive your High Holy Day tickets.
- Members must purchase guest tickets for children older than 22 years who are not full-time students and for other family guests: tickets are \$100 each.

High Holy Day Guest Ticket Policy

Below are our policies for purchasing guest tickets:

- Visitors and guests who are members of another Reform synagogue are welcomed. Synagogues have a reciprocity form which can be faxed to Temple Beth El confirming membership in good standing. These forms should be faxed to 704-366-1365.
- Guest tickets are available for non-members for \$200 each. Seating for non-members will be in the Archer Chapel with closed circuit TVs for viewing services.
- Families who resign their membership at Temple Beth El may not purchase guest tickets for 3 years after their resignation.
- Full time students at all colleges and universities, and members of the military will receive guest tickets at no charge.

Parking

Due to the limited number of parking spaces at Shalom Park, the Foundation of Shalom Park will clearly designate which spaces are for Temple Beth El and for Temple Israel members. **Parking passes MUST BE DISPLAYED IN VEHICLE WINDOW AT ALL TIMES.**

- Families with children using our babysitting at the early services will be issued a parking pass.
- Upon request, those with a valid NC handicapped placard or permanent handicapped license plate will be issued a handicapped parking pass.
- All members at the Sustainer levels will be issued parking passes – annual renewal forms must be returned to Temple by September 1, 2011 in order to receive the parking pass.
- Those who renew at the dollar level for their membership type will get the remaining parking passes on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Shuttle buses will pick up those not parking at Shalom Park at a remote lot (to be announced).
