Moving Forward by Looking Outward in Gratitude

I love waking up on the morning after Yom Kippur. It is a new beginning. After several months of being consumed with High Holy Day preparations, I can finally look outside the walls of our congregation. With a clear mind, I can relax and watch my kids play soccer or go with them for bike rides. I can more actively engage, once again, with the Charlotte community beyond Beth El.

Our Jewish holiday cycle calls us to move our focus outward. We move forward from the profound self-reckoning of ourselves and our relationships during the Tens Days of Awe to celebrating the bounty of the world on Sukkot. We head outdoors to our booths and invite guests to enter.

As American Jews, we are blessed with two holidays of Thanksgiving: Sukkot and the American festival of Thanksgiving. Both require a great deal of preparation and food. Both require that we share our harvest with those around us. Both inspire us to open our homes with the warmest of hospitality to others. Both urge us to open eyes to the beauty that abounds. Both inspire us to show our gratitude by recalling our history and by sharing our abundance with those in need.

This year at Temple Beth El, we have even more reasons for gratitude. During the past two years we have been wandering, dependent on the kindness of churches to house us for our holy days. This Thanksgiving, we are home, and we have the chance to show our gratitude by opening our sanctuary to the broader community as we host our citywide interfaith Thanksgiving service.

Like the personal and Jewish journeys outward following the High Holy Days, we have a congregational opportunity to reach outward inviting into our midst for a Thanksgiving service a 200-person-strong Interfaith Adult and Children's Choir and likely 1,500 Charlotteans who will be in attendance. Our close friend, Monsignor John McSweeney from St. Matthew Catholic Church, will move us with his sermon entitled, "The Gratitude Factor." Though, I imagine, words will not even be needed to express our deep sense of thankfulness.

On November 22 at 7:00 pm, we will host Charlotte's 36th Annual Citywide Interfaith Thanksgiving Service sponsored by our congregation and by Mecklenburg Ministries. Join us as we look outward and invite our broader community into the amazing Beth El we have created.
