TGIS: Thank God It's Shabbat!

Just days from when you receive this bulletin, the High Holy Days will be here. We pray that this New Year of 5771 will be sweet and fill your life with blessings. The High Holy Days are filled with awe; thousands come to participate. Just beyond these days will be our fall festivals, Sukkot and Simchat Torah, and then on October 1st, we will resume our schedule of two services each Friday night. When the Torah speaks of our calendar of holidays, Shabbat — created and called holy by God — is listed first. It is the most important as it comes each and every week. Without a consistent time for rest and renewal, our bodies, minds and souls would be diminished in strength.

On Friday late afternoon, as many of us make our way home from work, school or the endless carpools for our kids, we may find ourselves saying, "TGIS — Thank God It's Shabbat!" In rejoicing over this island of time with which we are blessed, hundreds of congregants celebrate the week's end by heading to Beth El for good food, good company, to reflect on the week gone by and to turn off the busy-ness of our week, letting our hearts, minds and souls experience the peace that is Shabbat.

While all of our **6:00 pm services** reflect our community gathered in fellowship and prayer, each has a slightly different flavor; so, we've renamed them to capture their unique essence:

Thank God It's Shabbat: Rock the House - On the first Friday of each month, we will celebrate with our new Shabbat band, filling our service and our Sabbath with music to lift our hearts and our souls.

Thank God It's Shabbat: Take a Breath - On the second, fourth and fifth Friday of each month, a transformational service of music and prayer will enable us to make the transition from the hectic and mundane of our week to the peace and holiness of Shabbat (formerly Kabbalat Shabbat).

Thank God It's Shabbat: Letting Go of the Week - On the third Friday of each month and modeled after our ever-popular Summer Shabbat service, we

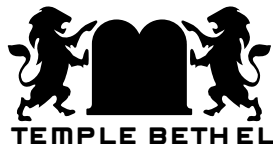
